# **Cohen SoundWaters Harbor Center Launches**

# Completing Four-Year \$17.5 Million Campaign, SoundWaters Opens Environmental Education and Youth Development Facility on Stamford Harbor

*Stamford, CT* – In a ceremony on Thursday afternoon at Boccuzzi Park in Stamford's Waterside neighborhood, SoundWaters officially opened the Cohen SoundWaters Harbor Center.

In keeping with SoundWaters maritime heritage, SoundWaters Chair, Doug Bora, flanked by federal, state, city and SoundWaters officials, launched the Harbor Center as one would launch a new ship, by smashing a bottle of champagne on the front of the new building. Guests then streamed into the building to get their first look at the sparking, 12,800 ft<sup>2</sup> two-story educational facility.

Leigh Shemitz, SoundWaters president said: "The Harbor Center has been a dream of SoundWaters and for the former Young Mariners Foundation – which merged with SoundWaters in 2016 – for close to two decades. This location on a thriving Stamford Harbor offers unrivaled access for students from Stamford and surrounding communities to learn about, learn from and learn to protect Long Island Sound. Our community is stronger when we are connected to - and learning - from the Sound. The new Cohen SoundWaters Harbor Center will provide a new generation of students that means to access, train, learn and explore the natural world."

Shemitz thanked the assembled donors whose unwavering support raised \$17.5 million to construct the Harbor Center and provide on-going support for the educational, sailing and maritime workforce development programs that will take place there.

"We are so deeply grateful to the Steven & Alexandra Cohen Foundation for providing their leadership gift of \$3 million and giving us the confidence to seek support from the community through an unprecedented pandemic and economic uncertainties. Our goal to provide programs offering life skills, college skills and job skills resonated with supportive and caring families across the community," Shemitz added.

# About the Cohen SoundWaters Harbor Center

The Cohen SoundWaters Harbor Center is located on Stamford Harbor in John J. Boccuzzi Park at 200 Southfield Avenue. The 12,800 ft<sup>2</sup> building was designed to meet the needs of three anchor SoundWaters programs:

- Young Mariners Academy: Direct water access for sailing and classroom space for life skills and academic skills development for middle school students.
- SoundWaters Research Intensive: 12-month access to the SoundWaters research vessel and ample lab space specially designed for advanced marine research to prepare high school students for science as a focus for college or career.
- Harbor Corps: Custom-designed and fully equipped workshop to train and prepare young people for entry level jobs and careers in the maritime trades.

During the summer, the Harbor Center will also include launch access for SoundWaters' fleet of sailboats, and publicly available kayaks and paddleboards, as well as the organization's iconic three-masted schooner.

Annually, SoundWaters hosts shipboard and land-based education and development programs for more than 30,000 students from pre-K through high school.
