We collaborate with schools up and down Long Island Sound, from Oyster Bay to Old Saybrook — from Larchmont to Litchfield.

Stewardship, Science, Scholarship

Students engage at SoundWaters by getting into the environment. To learn about the water, you get into the water. To learn about animals, you go where they live.

SoundWaters programs give kids authentic, hands-on experience, unmatched by any textbook or smartboard. Students will draw upon what they've learned to make decisions as they grow older. When they learn to enjoy and respect Long Island Sound as kids, they will continue to do so as adults. Three of our school year programs present great examples:

Science Stars: All Girls, All Science, All Week

Over 120 Stamford school girls joined SoundWaters during April school vacation to explore and pursue their interests and ignite a passion for science. On full scholarship, these young female scientists spent a week in the water, on the shore and in the lab.

Science on the Sound

There is something magical about studying Long Island Sound from the deck of a sailing ship as 4,357 students did on the Schooner *SoundWaters*, immersed in the environment, having fun, learning and making memories. Students study navigation, raise the sails and analyze the animals and water they sample from the ship.
